



Farewell to Odie, Australia's most well-travelled dog



It is with great sadness we announce the very sad passing of Seeing Eye Dog Odie who was 10 years old. He was a fantastic guide and totally devoted to his handler, and VA staff member, Chris.

Just as importantly, Odie was a very much-loved member of both Chris's and the Vision Australia family

Odie was also the most frequently flown dog in Australia notching up some impressive flying time, flying more than 130,000km in over 200 flights across Australia accompanying Chris on many adventures, not to mention a number of TV appearances too!

Taking flights and attending important meetings with Chris was part of his day job, which Odie fulfilled with incredible loyalty and efficiency, winning hearts wherever he wagged his tail.

Odie was even welcomed onto the Federal Parliament floor, the first time a dog has ever been granted access.

The Virgin Australia crew were especially sad when Odie retired. On their final flight together, the team formed a guard of honour. It was an emotional moment for Chris, but Odie took it all in his stride – especially when he saw his special doggie cake.

Odie will also greatly missed by all, including his poodle sibling Murphy and younger Seeing Eye Dog sister Eva.

Thank for your years of service Odie, you were one of a kind.

Build a better bowl

Mix up the menu for healthier, happier pets

As humans we love variety and a mix of tastes and textures for each meal – why would we treat our beloved pets any differently? The way to a dog's heart is through their tummy, so here are our steps to building your dog a better bowl, keeping their meals nutrient rich and exciting.

1. Start with a great base

Dry food is nutrient rich and should be used as a base for all your dog's meals. The sweet spot for most dogs is 70% dry mixed in with 30% additions.

2. Add your protein
